



Declaration of the Plenary Assembly of the Forum of Parliaments of the Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) following its Sixth Ordinary Session held in Luanda, Republic of Angola, from 1st to 3rd December 2015

The Plenary Assembly,

Considering the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region signed in Nairobi on 15th December 2006;

Considering further the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Agreement Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of the Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) signed in Kigali on 4th December 2008;

Having considered and deliberated during its Sixth Ordinary Plenary Session held in Angola from 1st to 3rd December, 2015, on the items on its agenda, the Plenary Assembly:

1. Adopted the Resolutions on:


- a) The political, security and humanitarian situation in Republic of Burundi;
- b) The political, security and humanitarian situation in Central African Republic;
- c) The political, security and humanitarian situation in Democratic Republic of the Congo;
- d) The political, security and humanitarian situation in the Republic of South Sudan;
- e) The role of Parliaments in the improvement of the electoral process of the member country of the ICGLR.

2. **Took** the decisions on:

- a) The membership of the Forum to the Inter-Parliamentary Union as an observer member;
 - b) The adoption of the 2015 activity report of the FP-ICGLR;
 - c) The adoption of the 2015 Financial Report of the FP-ICGLR ;
 - d) The adoption of the annual financial contributions of Member States of the FP-ICGLR;
 - e) The adoption of the 2016- 2017 budget of the FP-ICGLR;
 - f) The adoption of the Action Plan 2016 - 2017 of the Forum of Parliaments of the ICGLR;
 - g) The approval of the audit reports of the FP-ICGLR.
3. **Demanded** the governments and parliaments of the Member States of the ICGLR in general and especially those that are expected to hold elections in 2016 to take necessary measures to ensure free, transparent and credible elections, given the impact of elections in the stability and security of Nations ;
4. **Decided** to deploy a parliamentary fact-finding mission to the Republic of Burundi, before the end of the year 2015, to assess the political, security and humanitarian situation obtaining in the Republic of Burundi and make recommendations to the Forum of Parliaments of the ICGLR;
5. **Thanked** Member Parliaments that have paid their financial contributions to the Forum and called upon those that have yet to pay, to fulfill their annual financial contributions and pay arrears to the FP-ICGLR as soon as possible, in accordance with the decision of the session setting the levels of contributions, to enable the Forum to implement its programmes;
6. **Congratulated** Member Parliaments for their massive, active and constructive participation in the work of this Plenary Assembly;
7. **Presented** its sincere thanks to the President of the Republic of Angola, His Excellency José Eduardo dos Santos, the Parliament, the Government and the people of Kenya for the warm and fraternal welcome, material and logistical support provided towards the organization and hosting of this session and for their hospitality;
8. **Thanked** the Association of European Parliamentarians Partners with Africa (AWEPA) for the financial assistance in the organization of the Fifth Plenary Assembly;

9. **Decided** that the Ordinary Seventh Session of the Plenary Assembly will be held in Khartoum from 6th to 9th December, 2016 in Khartoum, Republic of Sudan.

RESOLUTION 6OSPA/05/2015

RESOLUTION ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF ELECTORAL PROCESSES IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION

THE SIXTH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE PLENARY ASSEMBLY OF THE FORUM OF PARLIAMENTS OF MEMBER STATES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GREAT LAKES REGION:

- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes region signed in Nairobi on 15th December, 2006;
- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Accord Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region signed on 1st December, 2006 in Kigali, Republic of Rwanda;
- **Considering** the recommendations adopted at the end of the capacity building seminar for Parliamentarians on the electoral processes in the Great Lakes Region held from 19th to 20th October 2015 in Dar Es Salaam, United Republic of Tanzania;
- **Considering** the commitment made by the Heads of the State and Government of the ICGLR as part of the Pact of Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region to foster electoral stable electoral process through democratic, free and transparent throughout the great lakes Region;
- **Commending** the work by the Committee on Democracy and Good Governance of the Forum of Parliaments of the ICGLR during the Election Observation Mission in the United Republic of Tanzania and in the Republic of the Sudan as well as the support provided by the General Secretariat of the ICGLR facilitating the work of the Committee;

- **Determined** to ensure that the Government and Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region commit to improve the electoral processes in the Great Lakes Region in order to transform the region into a peaceful land;
1. **Requests** the Parliaments and Government of the ICGLR Member States to :
- a) Take necessary legislative and institutional measures to promote electoral cycle with regular intervals in accordance with international standards;
 - b) Establish independent institutions tasked with the organisation and the management of elections;
 - c) Promote civic education of populations in the field of elections;
 - d) Take necessary measures in order to improve the mechanisms designed to ensure the organization of democratic, free and transparent elections especially by resorting to new information and communication technologies such as biometric registration of voters, electronic voting, the consolidation of the elections results;
 - e) Promote perfect collaboration and trust between the different stakeholders in the electoral process;
 - f) Facilitate and promote the missions of national and international electoral observers;
 - g) Establish mechanisms to enable the people of the Diaspora to participate in the elections;
 - h) To ratify and domesticate, for those that have not done so, the international instruments pertaining to the elections including the African Charter on Democracy and Good Governance and the ICGLR Protocol on Democracy and Governance; and to make sure that they are domesticated into their domestic legal orders;
 - i) Make sure that all the stakeholders reach a consensus in the development and/or amendment of the Constitution in accordance with national and international standards;
 - j) Member States should take necessary measures to implement international instruments pertaining to elections that they have ratified;

- k) National Parliaments should play oversight roles to ensure implementation of the international instruments pertaining to elections that have been ratified by their countries;
2. **Calls upon** international and regional organizations particularly the African Union and the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region:
- a) To establish a follow-up mechanism for the ratification and deposit procedures of international legal instruments on Democracy and Good Governance as well as the monitoring-evaluation of the implementation of these instruments.
- b) To promote and strengthen the electoral observation missions in order to promote transparency and social cohesion.
3. **Requests** the Secretary General to monitor the implementation of this resolution on improving the electoral processes in the Great Lakes region.
4. **Decides** to remain seized on the matter.

RESOLUTION 6OSPA/02/2015

POLITICAL, SECURITY AND HUMANITAIRIAN SITUATION IN CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC

THE SIXTH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE PLENARY ASSEMBLY OF THE FORUM OF PARLIAMENTS OF MEMBER STATES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GREAT LAKES REGION:

- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes region signed in Nairobi on 15th December, 2006;
- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Accord Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of the Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region;
- **Recalling** its Resolution 5SOAP/01/2015 on the political, security and humanitarian situation in Central African Republic adopted on 22nd January, 2015;
- **Concerned** about the current situation prevailing in Central African Republic where there are several challenges notably those related to peace and security, justice and reconciliation, the rebuilding of social and economic fabric and the organization of free, open and transparent elections;
- **Considering** the urgent need to support the Central African Republic towards the restoration of the constitutional order, to carry out the disarmament, the demobilization and the reintegration of former combatants;
- **Considering** the importance of undertaking actions designed to promote justice and reconciliation taking into account both the specificity of the Central African crisis and the determination of Central African stakeholders to the fight against impunity;

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- **Considering** the collapse of the social and economic fabric in Central African Republic, its landlocked situation and the urgent need of economic development in order to meet the many and varied social requirements;
 - **Recognizing** the major role played by His Excellency Denis Sassou Nguesso, President of the Republic of Congo and International Mediator in the Central African crisis, the Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS), the African Union (AU), the United Nations (UN) and member States of the ICGLR in the management of the Central African crisis;
 - **Concerned** about the recent upsurges of insecurity and the killings of civilians recorded both in Bangui and in the Provinces;
 - **Noting with satisfaction** the efforts made by the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA) and the French contingent of the Sangaris operation to maintain order in CAR;
 - **Referring** to the report and recommendations of the seminar-workshop organized by the Forum of Parliaments of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) from 1st to 2nd April, 2015 in Bangui as part of exchange of experience between parliamentarians and parliaments of member States of the ICGLR on "the role and responsibilities of a parliamentarian in a peace process and national reconciliation in a post-conflict countries: case of CAR";
 - **Noting with satisfaction** the results of the Forum for national reconciliation held in Bangui from 4th to 11th May, 2015;
 - **Welcoming** the publication of a definitive calendar of electoral operations for the restoration of constitutional order in order to organize a constitutional referendum, presidential and legislative elections;
1. **Commends** the Government, the National Transitional Council and other transitional institutions of the Central African Republic for the positive evolution of the political situation in the country;
 2. **Commends** the United Nations Integrated Multidimensional Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA) and its French contingent Sangaris for its efforts towards the restoration of security;

3. **Condemns** the recent killings and sectarian violence that led to targeted killings of civilians in the Central African Republic especially in Bangui and Bambari ;
4. **Requests** that the Transitional Government strengthens the protection of the population by:
 - a. The rehabilitation of the republican defence and security forces through the mandatory disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration/Security Sector Reform (DDRR/SSR), the Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration (DDR) agreement signed between nine armed groups and the Ministry of Defence is an major step towards the resolution of the crisis in the Central African Republic ;
 - b. The development, adoption and implementation of the DDRR/RSS programme with the support of regional organizations and the international community.
5. **Calls upon** the Government of the Central African Republic and its partners to take the necessary measures to ensure the organization of free, fair, transparent and credible elections in accordance with both international and regional standards especially the ICGLR Protocol on Democracy and Good Governance;
6. **Requests** the Transitional Government to:
 - a) Strengthen the conventional justice through the restoration of the Permanent Military Tribunal;
 - b) Continue the process leading to the establishment of the Special Criminal Court in an effort to fight against impunity;
 - c) Create the necessary conditions for the effective independence of judges and the ethical practice of their profession;
 - d) Promoting and strengthening local justice by restoring the authority of headmen of villages and neighbourhoods and strengthening their capacities;
7. **Recommends** that the Transitional Government undertakes the necessary actions in an effort to ensure the exploitation of strategic natural resources, the development of plans and development strategies, the interconnection of isolated areas within the country, the promotion of the culture of entrepreneurship in order to reduce the unemployment and to allow the mentoring of vulnerable young people;

8. **Urges** the international community and regional organizations to:
 - a) To honour their commitments towards the Central African Republic in accompanying both the development and implementation of a reconstruction plan like the "Marshall Plan";
 - b) To continue to support the crisis exit process in Central African Republic through the electoral process and the DDR programme.
9. **Calls upon** the UN to lift both the sanctions and the ongoing arms embargo imposed on the Central African Republic, and urges the African States that are currently members of the United Nations Security Council to support this request, to facilitate the restoration of a functional national security force and to lift the measures concerning the diamond trade within the framework of the Kimberley process;
10. **Requests** the Secretary General of the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) to spare no efforts in ensuring that the FP-ICRGL is instrumental in supporting the National Transitional Council (NTC) in the performance its mission;
11. **Requests** the Secretary General of the Forum to pay special attention to the evolution of the political and security situation in the Central African Republic and to report to the next Plenary Assembly;
12. **Decides** to remain actively seized of the situation in the Central African Republic.

RESOLUTION 6OSPA/01/2015

POLITICAL, SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN REPUBLIC OF BURUNDI

THE SIXTH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE PLENARY ASSEMBLY OF THE FORUM OF PARLIAMENTS OF MEMBER STATES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GREAT LAKES REGION:

- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes region signed in Nairobi on 15th December, 2006;
 - **Considering** the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Accord Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of the Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region;
 - **Considering** the decision on the situation in Burundi adopted by the Peace and Security Council of the African Union (AU) at its 515th meeting held on 13th June, 2015 at the level of Heads of State and Government;
 - **Taking note** of the significant progress made in the Republic of Burundi since the signing of the Arusha Agreement for Peace and Reconciliation in the Republic of Burundi in 2000, in the areas of peace, stability and democratization which are gains that must be preserved and supported;
 - **Concerned** about the political and security situation that continues to deteriorate in the Republic of Burundi since the announcement on 26th April, 2015 of the candidacy of Mr. Pierre Nkurunziza as President of the Republic of Burundi for a new term in office;
1. **Condemns** all forms of violence against civilian populations and all kind of human rights violations as well as acts, writings and speeches likely to further worsen the situation. the Plenary is gravely concerned about the events that occurred in the Republic of Burundi since Sunday, 26th April, 2015 and regrets the loss of human lives and shares the grief of the bereaved families of the victims of these events;

2. **Strongly condemns** the attempted coup in the Republic of Burundi, which is a serious violation of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region, the Constitutive Act of the African Union and of the Charter of the United Nations;
3. **Calls upon** the Government of the Republic of Burundi to collaborate with stakeholders, including political parties and civil society, to hold a genuine inclusive dialogue aimed at reaching a consensus for the establishment of necessary conditions conducive to a peaceful settlement of the conflict in line with the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes Region;
4. **Requests** the Burundian authorities to continue to respect and implement the spirit and the letter of the provisions of the Arusha Peace and Reconciliation Agreement for Burundi and those of the 2005 Constitution of the Republic of Burundi ;
5. **Calls upon** all stakeholders in the Republic of Burundi to stop violence and continue the dialogue in the quest of peace;
6. **Calls upon** the Government of the Republic of Burundi to respect the constitutional rights of the people of Burundi and its obligations under the ICGLR Pact on Security, Stability and Development in particular the Protocol on Democracy and Good Governance to which Burundi is a signatory ;
7. **Fully supports** the decision of the Council for Peace and Security of the African Union in general and particularly the AU conviction that only inclusive dialogue bringing together the Burundian stakeholders could enable the Republic of Burundi to overcome the serious current difficulties and to prevent whatever may jeopardize the progress that have been made as a result of the Arusha Accord for Peace and reconciliation;
8. Requests the Burundian authorities and the concerned stakeholders to display a sense of responsibility in view of the political and security situation and give precedence to Burundi's general interest above all other consideration;
9. Takes note of the relevance of measures agreed by the Peace and Security Council (PSC) of the AU, at its 551st meeting held on 17th October, 2015 in support of the efforts to find a quick and consensual solution to the crisis in Burundi to impose targeted sanctions on all Burundian actors whose actions

and statements are fueling violence and hindering the quest for a solution to the crisis in Burundi.

10. **Requests** the East African Community (EAC) to continue the facilitation of the dialogue between the active forces of Burundi, in order to reach a peaceful solution to the political crisis, and encourages the various parties to the conflict to participate in the above dialogue ;
11. **Thanks** the countries that opened their borders to Burundian refugees notably the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the Republic of Rwanda and the United Republic of Tanzania and humanitarian agencies for their support to those affected. The plenary calls upon the international community to continue providing the necessary humanitarian assistance to these refugees, and to facilitate their return to Burundi;
12. **Calls upon** the Government of the Republic of Burundi to take necessary steps to stop the flow of refugees and encourage the return of those who are currently outside of Burundi to return home;
13. **Requests** the Secretary General of the Forum of Parliaments of member States of the ICGLR to monitor the political and security situation in the Republic of Burundi and to report at the next Plenary Assembly;
14. **Decides** to remain seized of the situation.

RESOLUTION 6OSPA/04/2015

POLITICAL, SECURITY AND HUMANITAIRIAN SITUATION IN REPUBLIC OF SOUTH SUDAN

THE SIXTH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE PLENARY ASSEMBLY OF THE FORUM OF PARLIAMENTS OF MEMBER STATES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GREAT LAKES REGION:

- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes region signed in Nairobi on 15th December, 2006;
- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Accord Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region;
- **Recalling** its resolution 5SOAP/03/2015 adopted on 22nd January, 2015 on the political, security and humanitarian situation in the Republic of South Sudan;
- **Noting** the significant progress likely to put an end to civil war in the Republic of South Sudan especially the signing of the IGAD mediated Peace Agreement on the Resolution of the conflict in the Republic of South Sudan in Addis Ababa on 14th August, 2015 and in Juba, on 26th August, 2015.
- **Noting** the efforts made by both the international and regional organizations notably the United Nations (UN), African Union (AU), the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) and the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) in order to achieve a comprehensive and definitive solution to the conflict and the restoration of peace, security and stability in the Republic of South Sudan;

- **Based** on the conclusions and recommendations contained in the reports of the parliamentary fact-finding missions conducted in the Republic of South Sudan respectively from 30th May to 04th June 2014 and from 22nd to 26th June 2015, by a delegation of the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region;
- 1. **Strongly condemns** the massacre of civilians, all forms of violence and human rights abuses committed in the Republic of South Sudan during the civil war especially in the Upper Nile, in Jonglei as well as in Unity;
- 2. **Commends** the Government of the Republic of South Sudan for signing the Peace Agreement on the Resolution of the conflict in the Republic of South Sudan and launching the political transition process in the Republic of South Sudan;
- 3. **Requests** the Government of the Republic of South Sudan and other political stakeholders to fully implement the Arusha Agreement for the reunification of the SPLM as well as the Peace Agreement on the Resolution of the conflict in the Republic of South Sudan to ensure the establishment of a democratic and inclusive system promoting good governance, capable to meet the fundamental needs of the population and to protect their human rights in the Republic of South Sudan;
- 4. **Welcomes** the signing of the IGAD mediated Peace Agreement on the Resolution of the conflict in the Republic of South Sudan in Addis Ababa on 17th August, 2015 and in Juba, on 26th August, 2015.
- 5. **Calls upon** the Government of the Republic of South Sudan and the United Nations (UNMISS) to enhance their cooperation to better protect civilians and secure the delivery of humanitarian aid;
- 6. **Welcomes** the role played by international and regional organizations in the quest for peace notably the United Nations (UN), African Union (AU), the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) and the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) and requests them to pursue their efforts in order to allow the people of the Republic of south Sudan to overcome their problems and find a lasting peace.

7. Urges humanitarian agencies to spare no efforts in supporting and assisting the internally displaced people and refugees. The Plenary calls for the establishment of an urgent programme designed to support women and vulnerable people stripped of everything with a view to ensure their reintegration;
8. Requests the Secretary General of the FP-ICGLR to spare no efforts in collaborating with the authorities of the Republic of South Sudan to ensure the sharing of experiences with other ICGLR Member States that have experienced similar situations;
9. Requests the Secretary General of the FP-ICGLR to ensure regular monitoring of the security situation in the Republic of South Sudan;
10. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

RESOLUTION 6OSPA/03/2015

POLITICAL, SECURITY AND HUMANITAIRIAN SITUATION IN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO

THE SIXTH ORDINARY SESSION OF THE PLENARY ASSEMBLY OF THE FORUM OF PARLIAMENTS OF MEMBER STATES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE GREAT LAKES REGION:

- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 4 and 22, paragraph 1 of the Pact on Security, Stability and Development in the Great Lakes region signed in Nairobi on 15th December, 2006;
- **Considering** the provisions of Articles 2 and 6 of the Inter-Parliamentary Accord Establishing the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region;
- **Recalling** its Resolution 5SOAP/02/2015 adopted on 22nd January 2015 relating to the political, security and humanitarian situation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo;
- **Deeply concerned** by the insecurity and humanitarian crisis in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo brought about by the destabilizing activities of both national and foreign armed groups and by the persistence of these armed groups especially the FDLR, the ADF-NALU committing massacres of civilians including in the territory of Beni in North Kivu Province;
- **Considering** that the electoral process has already begun in the Democratic Republic of the Congo;

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- **Noting** the efforts made by both international and regional organizations notably the UN, the AU, ICGLR and the Forum of Parliaments of the member States of the ICGLR to achieve a comprehensive solution to the conflicts in the east of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and restore security and stability in the member States of the Region;
 - **Welcoming** the signing of the Peace, Security and Cooperation framework for the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Region on 24th February, 2013 in Addis Ababa, as endorsed by the United Nations Security Council Resolution 2098 adopted on 28th March, 2013 authorizing the creation of an intervention brigade within the MONUSCO with the mission to neutralize the armed groups, to restore the state authority, to ensure the safety of civilians in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo and to pave the way for stabilization activities ;
 - **Noting furthermore** that the results achieved through the implementation of this Agreement;
1. **Strongly condemns** the resurgence of violence in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo, particularly the multiple and repeated killings of civilians by the ADF in Beni, eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo ;
 2. **Urges** the Government of the Democratic Republic of the Congo and all the parties concerned to ensure conducive environment to the holding of the presidential, legislative elections that are free, fair, credible, open, transparent and peaceful;
 3. **Encourages** the Government of the DRC to promote and strengthen cooperation with the MONUSCO and the countries of the region to continue the military offensive against the FDLR, ADF-NALU and other negative forces, with particular attention to neutralize their command structures;
 4. **Recommends** that the stakeholders of the Peace, Security and Cooperation framework for the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the region signed in Addis Ababa namely the Democratic Republic of

the Congo, the ICGLR member States, the United Nations and the African Union to speed up the full implementation of the above framework for the establishment of peace, security and stability in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the region;

5. **Requests** the Secretary General of the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the ICGLR to monitor the security situation in eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo and to report to the next Plenary Assembly;
6. **Decides** to remain seized of the situation.
