# **EDITORIAL**

**D**uring the February and March meeting, also referred to as the Legislative Meeting, the main focus for the National Assembly is the consideration of Bills which are later enacted into Law.

The public is expected to participate in this process by engaging both the Executive and the Legislature on matters that need new legislation or amendment of existing legislation.

The parliamentary reforms implemented in the last 10 years have created an opportunity for increased citizenry participation through various Parliamentary media platforms including Parliament Television, Parliament Radio, Facebook page and YouTube channel.

The Parliamentary Reforms Programme (Programme Management) Department will follow the February/March meeting with much interest.

Apart from the practice by every department of the National Assembly of following Parliamentary proceedings, the department follows the proceedings because it coordinates the operations of Constituency Offices through which members of the public interact with their representatives.

At constituency level, the National Assembly is represented by Constituency Offices which are meeting places for Members of Parliament and their constituents.

In this regard, it is expected that the people in the constituencies will also take keen interest in this meeting as they follow the debates in the House.

As Members of Parliament debate on possible laws, they represent the wishes of the people they represent in all the 156 constituencies.

Our Parliamentary staff in Constituency Offices will also need to follow the deliberations of the House in order to provide information to constituents that may seek clarity or wish to engage their elected leadership on some of the Bills under consideration.

As noted above and in past editorials, one of the ways the PRP (Programme Management) Department contributes to the core values of the

Legislature is by coordinating the work of the 156 Parliamentary Constituency Offices.

In this regard, the Institution has prioritised information sharing and capacity building for our staff in all offices.

We also want to ensure that our staff in the Parliamentary Constituency Offices understand that their work is critical to supporting the representative and legislative roles of Members of Parliament, hence the need for more research on the bills under consideration.

More research accompanied with the zeal to enhance capacity building means Parliamentarians and the National Assembly of Zambia will be well represented.

In her recent working visit to India, the Speaker of the National Assembly, Right Honourable Nelly B K Mutti, MP, highlighted the importance of capacity building and training.

Speaker Mutti pointed out that there was need to revive the training and capacity building credentials among Zambian Parliamentarians.

She said that this was going to enable Members of Parliament keep abreast with best practices and procedures for the smooth running of the House.

Apart from the consideration of Bills, the current meeting of the House will continue with other business including oversight over government policies and programmes.

Other business may include issues surrounding the Constituency Development Fund, gender matters and the fight against Climate Change.

It is expected that members of the public will submit issues through the Constituency Offices for consideration by the House through questions, motions and matters of urgent public importance.
