A BILL

ENTITLED

An Act to approve the excess expenditure of moneys aggregating two billion, seven hundred and seventy-one million, nine hundred and sixty-one thousand, nine hundred and eighty-four kwacha required for the services of the Republic during the financial year ended on 31st December, 2007.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Zambia.

Enactment

1. This Act may be cited as the Excess Expenditure Appropriation (2007) Act, 2010.

Short title

2. The expenditure on the services of the Republic during the financial year which ended on 31st December, 2007, of the moneys indicated in respect of the services in the third column of the Schedule, being expenditure in excess of the moneys appropriated for the services by the Appropriation Act, 2007, and the Supplementary Appropriation (2007) Act, 2009, is hereby approved.
